ODONTOCRABRO

Odontocrabro Tsuneki, 1971a:22. Type species: *Odontocrabro abnormis* Tsuneki, 1971, by original designation and monotypy.

Revision: Marshakov, 1980a; Hensen, 1989 (key to species); Leclercq, 1991c (review of species); Řiha, 2007 (key to females of Asiatic species).

1. *abnormis* Tsuneki

2. *antropovi* Leclercq

3. *binderis* Marshakov

4. *marocanus* Leclercq

5. *orthodoxus* Hensen

6. *reticulatus* Řiha

Odontocrabro reticulatus Řiha, 2007:205, ♀, ♂. Holotype: ♀, Western Malaysia: Pahang: Tanah Rata 35 km south-southeast of Ipoh in Cameron Highlands at 4°28'N 101°23'E (M. Řiha personal collection, Brno, Czech Republic). Paratypes: Thailand. – Řiha, 2007:207 (in key to females of Asiatic *Odontocrabro*).

7. *saharae* Leclercq

8. *temporalis* (Gussakovskij)

Crabro temporalis Gussakovskij, 1952:265, ♀, ♂. Lectotype: ♀, Tajikistan: Kondara Canyon north of Dushanbe (ZIL), designated by Marshakov, 1980a:325. – **As *Crossocerus temporalis***: R.
